Friends in Christ:

On several occasions in recent months, one member of our congregation has said, "Bill, give me some hope." I think this member speaks for many of us. Hope can seem hard to come by in these days—but it is what we need. And you have called me to be the one who gives some hope.

So let me start with someone I often turn to in times such as these. Remember how Martin Luther King put it: "There is a great benign Power in the universe whose name is God, and God is able to make a way out of no way, and transform dark yesterdays into bright tomorrows. This is our hope for becoming better men and women. This is our mandate for seeking to make a better world."

Hope asks the question: "What kind of future are we building for ourselves?" In other words, hope is not about positive thinking or wishing hard that something might happen. Hope asks about what we are *doing*.

So, the question comes to each of us as individuals and all of us as a congregation: What kind of future are we building? What action can we take—even today—to bring us closer to our desires? What harvest do we want to gather?

This is not the time for the silence that stifles the outrage we feel.

This is not the time for the silence that stifles calls for change.

This is the time to recover hope in a world that can seem hopeless.

This is the time to recover hope in society that can create so much despair.


HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE RECOGNITION—JUNE 5:




JUNE 5—STREETS CLOSED DURING IOWA ARTS FESTIVAL

MISSION BOARD NEWS

This is an interesting time for all to be serving on the Congregational UCC Mission Board. New volunteer opportunities, educational newsletters, a racial justice course, and money to be distributed are important aspects of our work right now. This is a briefly summary current Mission Board initiatives, along with the names of board members active in each:



- 1. Coralville Food Pantry \$10,000 donation Financial documents from the Food Pantry have been reviewed and the Council approved this funding from our Engagement Fund at the May meeting. Bruce Reynolds initiated this effort and prepared the Council request forms.
- 2. All board members are thinking of a way to acknowledge current volunteer efforts of members of our congregation.
- 3. Change Agent Newsletter Donna Hirst is spearheading this with editorial assistance from Megan Carnes and Bill Lovin. *(cont'd)*

- 4. Racial Justice course Laurie Stunz and Donna are moving this along with Rev. Dr. Velda Love from the UCC national office.
- 5. Temple Hiatt's presentation on the gun amendment on the November ballot in Iowa Provided in August or September Donna is coordinating.
- 6. United Action for Youth Includes donations for summer camping trip, Festival of Flowers and consideration for long term funding for transitional housing. Hope Spragg in leading these initiatives.
- 7. Donna is leading an initiative to find volunteer Ambassadors to help with racial conflict in the Iowa City schools.
- 8. Hope Lodge meal was prepared by congregational volunteers and delivered for the residents on Monday the 9th of May.
- 9. Agape Cafe is requesting funds from CRC members to provide once weekly breakfasts at Old Brick year-round. Chuck is in contact with CRC to clarify financial needs. (cont'd)
- 10. Dream City Needed supplies for summer program at Purpose Place (Kingdom Center) in the South District. \$1000 donated from our mission funds. Donna is coordinating.
- 11. Jane Kinney met with Deb Dunkhase at Open Heartland and is coordinating potential volunteer activities in the Hispanic population. Potential monetary donations also under consideration.
- 12. Little Creations Preschool needs funds for teacher education and kitchen renovations. Donna will find out more and proposes a large donation.
- 13. Houses to Homes Chuck is following up
- 14. Afghan Immigrant project with Faith UCC currently on hold Chuck

Rev. Robert Molsberry to be Acting Conference Minister of Tri-Conference

Dear Partners in Ministry in the Iowa, Nebraska, & South Dakota Conferences,

With joy, the Tri-Conference Board of Directors has affirmed Rev. Phil Hart as Interim Executive Conference Minister. His start date will be August 1st. Rev. Hart has served as Interim Conference Minister in five Conferences of the United Church of Christ and in the Ohio Conference twice. He has also served as a local pastor, Professor of Theology and Communication, Licensed Social Worker, and is a Certified Mediator through the Ohio Supreme Court.

In meeting with the Tri-Conference Board, Rev. Hart said that one of his hopes for the coming year is, "To live out the hope and faith I truly have that God will be with us and guide us all through these times." This commitment to a faith lived out in relationship with others commends Rev. Hart to the Executive Conference Minister position in such a time as this. We look forward to his leadership in the coming months.

To serve in the months between ECM Brigit Stevens' departure and Rev. Phil Hart's arrival the Tri-Conference Board of Directors has appointed Rev. Bob Molsberry as Acting Executive Conference Minister. Rev. Molsberry has served many incarnations of the church over his career including local church ministry in Iowa, Illinois, and Missouri, community development in Central America, and Conference Ministry in Ohio.

A graduate of Yale Divinity School, Rev. Molsberry has published numerous articles about Central America, and is the author of two books, "Blindsided by Grace: Entering the World of Disability," and "Tour de Faith: A Cyclist's Lessons for Living." These books explore the changes that Rev. Molsberry has dealt with since a hit-and-run accident in 1997 left him paraplegic. Since that time he has been an advocate for disability issues and has made numerous presentations on disability and ministry.

We are excited to welcome Rev. Molsberry into this role.
