### Beatles-themed Worship Sunday, July 17th

Come enjoy a Beatles sing-along worship service Sunday, July 17<sup>th</sup>. Why the Beatles?

It's the year 2022, the year of my 50<sup>th</sup> high school reunion--1972.

The Bible's John and Paul preached the importance of love in the New Testament. In the 60's and 70's another John and Paul (Ringo and George) shared the importance of love in another century and in another cultural venue. In the spirit of love, we will offer a very much needed experience of Beatles' love in the context of a worship service.



There are many spiritual (and appropriate social justice) aspects of the Beatles music. Common threads of love, helping each other, and living in peace are universal in their music and in our belief as followers of Christ. Their music touched on longing, joy, community, and sorrow. It would be appropriate to reflect on the ways their songs entered our consciousness...the consciousness of our nation and our own consciousness, as believers. For some of us, these great songs and their messages spoke to our lives and changed us for the better.
