Friends in Christ:

One of the nice things about Easter is that it just keeps going.

We are given the "twelve days" of Christmas and then the tree and decorations come down, the candles are extinguished, and we are left with the cold of winter.

Easter, however, lasts for fifty days in the springtime of the year. Those of you who are familiar with the calendar of the church year know that Easter is a "season" stretching from Easter Sunday until the day of Pentecost (when we celebrate God's gift of the Holy Spirit). Traditionally, Congregationalists haven't had much to do with the church year although in the past 50 years or so we've come to a new appreciation special days and times. Now when Easter arrives, we give ourselves seven weeks to reflect on the meaning of the resurrection for our lives and our world.

And, really, that's just the beginning. Each Sunday in the year is actually a "little Easter"—an occasion to celebrate God overcoming death in Jesus Christ and the small and large ways God continues to overcome death in our lives and in our world. Each week we are reminded of God's powerful, life-giving love.

In one of my favorite parts of Bach's *Easter Oratorio*, Peter and John sing: "Laughter and merriment attend our hearts, for our Salvation is risen." Now is a time for rejoicing together and laughing together and worshipping together.

#### The Circle of the Church Year

I invite you to take a closer look at the Christian Education Bulletin Board in Rockwood Hall. It is a display of our church school curriculum from this past year.

#### ADULT EDUCATION SESSIONS CONCLUDE A YEAR OF EXPLORING PO-LARIZATION AND THE FUTURE OF DEMOCRACY

Since last September our Sunday morning adult education sessions have been considering how we talk with each other in this polarized time. Among other resources, we've watched several videos from Princeton Theological Seminary's "Future of American Democracy" series.

We'll wrap up our sessions on the first three Sundays in May, considering "Does Institutional Christianity Have a Future?" with Rev. Adam Russell Taylor, President of Sojourners, and Rev. Dr. Russell Moore, Public Theologian at Christianity Today. They discuss the ongoing role Christian institutions play in supporting the project of democracy, and how political binaries work against our identities as siblings in Christ.

We'll also listen as Princeton Theological Seminary faculty discuss the impact of polarization on students, campus culture, the classroom, and how theological education offers a way forward., in "Is Life Together Still Possible? Polarization and Princeton Seminary."



A year ago, the Mission Board responded to requests from the congregation and created an Online Social Change Bulletin Board. This monthly email publication is an alert system that includes notices of rallies, petitions, upcoming legislative or policy actions warranting letters or phone calls, protests, important meetings of the school board or city council, each of which has the potential to increase social justice. Highest priority alerts are local actions, then state actions

and national actions. Notices do not support political candidates or parties.


