#### FURNANCES AND AIR CONDITIONERS WERE REPLACED IN EARLY AUGUST HERE'S HOW YOU CAN HELP NOW



Two months ago, the Church Council voted to conduct a capital campaign to defray part of the \$70,000 cost associated with replacing our 25-year-old heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) system. As steps were being taken to launch the capital campaign, we learned of a substantial gift made to our church with the intent of covering more than half of the cost of the new system. Upon hearing this good news, both the church's Trustees and Stewardship boards met and agreed that under these circumstances, a capital campaign was no longer needed—in effect, its goals had been met with one very generous gift. *(cont'd)* 

Consequently, on Tuesday, August 22, the Church Council met and canceled plans for a capital campaign. This is good news!

Because the remaining balance of the cost for the new heating and cooling system will be paid for out of the church's reserve funds, the Church Council still encourages individuals and families to make gifts to the HVAC Fund. As Trustees chair Kevin Richards said on Sunday, in a 155-year-old church, there will continue to be numerous expenses associated with our building. These include tuckpointing north and west sides of the church, replacing windows and window frames in Bill's office, replacing windows in the Community Pastoral Counseling Service (CSPS) office, replacing the sink by the CSPS bathroom, tearing out the old kitchen in the Education wing, installing a new toilet in the Education wing, installing in the chapel, applying lots of paint to the east wing exterior, upgrading the largest service panel, making repairs at the church's entrance—repairing the ornate trim that surrounds the door as well as the north bottom side of the door which has some rot, and completing other projects as well.

As much as possible, therefore, the church appreciates individual contributions toward the new HVAC equipment so that the church's "rainy day" funds can be saved for a rainy day. Thanks, as always, for your generous giving.

### SERVING THE CHURCH

Every year in January a slate of new members for the various church boards is presented to the congregation for approval. Work to prepare this slate occurs throughout the fall and is managed by the two Council Members At Large, Megan Carnes and Andrea Rauer.



This work is now underway, and we would like to invite all members of the congregation to consider serving on a Board. Serving on a Board is an excellent way to develop close working relations with other members of the church.

What is involved in serving on a Board? Each of the six church Boards meet monthly, often on a week day evening. Each of the boards has different responsibilities, and thus the tasks undertaken by each board are different. For example, the Membership Board plans the church picnic and other fellowship events; the Trustees provide oversight of the church budget and the building.

In addition to positions on church boards, there are also a number of positions representing the church to particular agencies or organizations. Members of the church serve as representatives to the Eastern Iowa Association, the Community Pastoral Counseling Service, the Common Fund and a number of others. As an alternative to serving on a church board, you might serve as a special church representative.
