Friends in Christ:

Life in our congregation is changing. When the Church Council met in November, I told them I'm not using words like "difficult" and "challenging" nearly as much as I have in the past 3 ½ years. Instead, I'm using "exciting," "new," and "energizing" when talking about our life together. A new spirit seems to have come upon us. We are looking forward, trying new things, and finding energy for the tasks ahead.

And while I also usually don't say things such as this, I have also expressed my sense that this is nothing less than the Spirit of God creating something new in us and among us and through us. I'm not ready to say just what that new thing is, but I keep looking for it and seeking to understand it.

Our theme for Advent this year is "Keeping Watch Together." It reminds us that discovering the new things that God is doing is a group activity. No one of us sees it all. We need each other. Advent is a season that looks ahead as much as behind. In these days—and, really, in all our days—we are urged to stay awake, to keep alert, to watch. We look with expectation for what has been called "the coming again of our second chance."

The days grow short. Almost as an act of resistance, we begin our worship with adults and children standing where all can see them and lighting a candle—a reminder to us that the light of God still shines in the darkness. The light fades early, but we say it will not always be so.

The leaves turn brown and fall. We take pine and balsam and holly—*ever*greens—and turn them into living circles with neither beginning nor end. As nature points toward death and decay, we turn our sights toward resurrection and new life.

God is doing something new. Let us keep watch together.

Premiered and recorded by the acclaimed Voces8 in 2020, this gorgeous five-movement setting of the Magnificat is scored for SATB divisi voices and soprano solos (featuring Rachel Burchett and Marie Von Behren) with organ, harp, and percussion. The second movement is in English, opening and closing with a soloist. The remaining movements are choral only and are in Latin.
