#### Friends in Christ:

In the United Church of Christ we often speak of ourselves as people who offer an "extravagant welcome," as those who extend "radical hospitality." Sometimes that seems a little congratulatory as a self-description. But it reminds us that incorporating people into this congregation is more than giving a handshake and a smile at the beginning of worship or providing artisanal donut holes after worship.

The radical hospitality that we offer grows out of a spirit of generosity, a desire to make this congregation and this building a safe and welcoming home for all people.

Being a church with a generous spirit, a church that extends an extravagant welcome, means that we can be a place of refuge, a haven in an often heartless world. We've been doing this for some time now; which means that quite often we don't even think about what we're doing—how unique and how important this is. And we need to keep doing this because so many churches don't.

The new school year begins and we find another way in which our generous welcome is needed.

Loneliness is a problem for college freshmen, but my guess is that it's a problem for new graduate students and for continuing students of all classes and ages. In fact, in a survey of nearly 28,000 students on 51 campuses by the American College Health Association a few years ago, more than 60% of students said that they had "felt very lonely" in the previous 12 months. Nearly 30% said that they had felt that way in the previous two weeks.

This fall we are called to discover anew what an extravagant welcome look like to all students and especially to those who are alone. We are called to do something about loneliness on campus. We are called to welcome students in a way that addresses the emptiness that so many feel.

Near the end of the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells that final parable that is both challenging and encouraging parable. In it we hear: "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." (Matthew 25:35) As the fall semester begins—and until graduation in the spring—may we be such people.

In addition to positions on church boards, there are also several positions representing the church to particular agencies or organizations. Members of the church serve as representatives to the Eastern Iowa Association, the Community Pastoral Counseling Service, the Common Fund, and other organizations. As an alternative to serving on a church board, you might serve as a special church representative.

#### SCREENING OF GOD AND COUNTRY—SEPTEMBER 8

A group of people from various religious communities here in Johnson County have come together in recent weeks to plan and sponsor free public screenings of the documentary *God and Country*. From producer Rob Reiner, *God and Country* examines the implications of Christian nationalism and how it distorts not only our constitutional republic but Christianity itself. Through the voices of prominent leaders, constitutional scholars, and journalists, the film asks the question: "What happens when a faith built on love, sacrifice, and forgiveness grows political tentacles, conflating power, money, and belief into hyper-nationalism." There will be a free screening of *God and Country* on Sunday, September 8 @ 2:00 p.m. at the Iowa City Public Library. A discussion will follow.



What does a Christianity look like that is not deeply tied to racial injustice and White Christian nationalism, forces captured in the images of the January 6, 2021 insurrection? With a national election just around the corner, how might Christians live into a richer narrative that underscores the nonviolent legacy of Jesus?

<u>Join us</u> for an intimate, online conversation with three renowned thought leaders on the current state of Christianity in the US. Our guests <u>Gary Dorrien</u>, <u>Obery Hendricks</u>, and <u>Grace Ji-Sun Kim</u> are internationally known for their insights on the Christian faith and the role that it can play for those committed to democracy, peace, and social justice. The *Christian Century*'s editor/publisher <u>Peter W. Marty</u> will serve as moderator.


#### SHELTER HOUSE BBQ BASH—SEPTEMBER 27

#### WINTER CLOTHING DISTRIBUTION COMING IN OCTOBER

The Winter Clothing Distribution (WCD), sponsored by the Consultation of Religious Congregations, will be from the afternoon of Sunday, 10/13, through the early afternoon of Saturday, 10/19. Over the span of these days we will set up, accept clothing donations, sort & organize clothing, distribute the clothing, & clean up after the event. A detailed schedule will be provided by late August.

The event will be held in the gymnasium of The River Community Church (RCC), 3001 Muscatine Avenue, in Iowa City. This facility has plenty of parking space and is on a bus route.

This year CRC will be partnering with the Iowa City Police Department (ICPD), which will provide clothing donations & volunteers. Shortly after the 2023 event, the ICPD held a one-day WCD at Mercer Park Recreation Center, distributing about 1,000 coats donated at their community collection boxes. They were interested in developing a new approach, so a community facilitator brought CRC & ICPD representatives together for a series of meetings that culminated in this partnership.

For 2024 we will be increasing the number of family representative shoppers to 10 per 30- minute period. (Eight individuals will need to register via SignUpGenius; there will be two openings for drop-ins.) Volunteers will also need to enroll via SignUpGenius.

As in past years, they are looking for donations of gently used or new WARM winter wear, with an emphasis on coats, snow pants, hats, mittens, gloves, scarves, boots & winter shoes. Heavy sweaters & sweatshirts are also appreciated.

Your donations of quality winter clothing & your volunteer participation will be most greatly appreciated! Further details will be provided in coming weeks.

FALL DIAPER DRIVE for CommUnity Food Bank: The Mission Board will hold a diaper drive in September and October to help the Food Bank replenish its supply of diapers for families in need. The Food Bank relies on donations for non-food items such as disposable diapers. Please help babies and toddlers in our community stay dry, clean, and healthy by participating in the diaper drive. Diaper sizes 3, 4, 5, and 6 are the most needed as well as baby wipes. There are two ways you can help. Buy a package of disposable diapers and wipes and bring them to Rockwood Hall. We will ensure that everything is delivered to the Food Bank. Or, if you would like to make a personal donation to



support this drive, please write a check to the church with Diaper Drive on the memo line and the Mission Board will use the funds to purchase diapers. Whichever way you choose, your donation will help restock the Food Bank's diaper supply, provide free diapers for babies and toddlers in need and bring some economic relief to families.
