Friends in Christ:

On the first Sunday in October we demonstrate our connection with Christians around the world by celebrating World Communion Sunday. We recognize that in spite of differences in nationality, economic condition, race, geography, and politics, we are united with women and men around the globe through our common faith in the God revealed to us in Jesus Christ.

In a sense, we at Congregational UCC live out this reality all year long. Members are traveling or returning from travels abroad all the time. Students worshipping with us come from around the world. Our native lands are many and relatives can still be found in them. On World Communion Sunday, we're just a little more aware that we are united with other Christians beyond national boundaries. We acknowledge our common faith and our common humanity. And we acknowledge our common share in the suffering of the world. Out of this awareness, we also work toward common purposes with people of other faiths as well.

In the Congregational tradition we find ourselves involved with the poor, the hungry, the outcast—with those throughout the world who are often pushed to the edges. By faith we recognize that we're all in this together. We are Congregationalists. We may not talk much *about* our faith. But at our best we are great at *living* our faith out in the open.

We are called to a broader, more open faith in these days: a faith that lets up on the restrictions and seeks a new freedom; a faith that seeks a new acceptance of one another in all our differences; a faith that transcends fear and moves toward love, bringing others along with us on that journey led by God.

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY

October 6 is World Communion Sunday. **2024 marks the eighty-eighth year of celebrating this day.** World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) originated in the Presbyterian Church in 1936. From the beginning, it was planned so that other denominations could join in the celebration of this day. After a few years the idea spread. Through our prayers and music on this day we recognize our connection with Christians in every nation.

SERVING OUR CONGREGATION

Every year in January a slate of new members for the various church boards is presented to the congregation for approval. Work to prepare this slate occurs throughout the fall and is managed by the two Council Members At Large, Andrea Rauer and Marie Von Behren.

This work is now underway, and we would like to invite all members of the congregation to consider serving on a Board. Serving on a Board is an excellent way to develop close working relations with other members of the church.

What is involved in serving on a Board? Each of the six church Boards meet monthly, usually on a week day evening. Each of the boards has different responsibilities, and thus the tasks undertaken by each board are different. For example, the Membership Board plans the church picnic and other fellowship events; the Trustees provide oversight of the church budget and the building.

In addition to positions on church boards, there are also several positions representing the church to various agencies and organizations. Members of the church serve as representatives to the Eastern Iowa Association, the Community Pastoral Counseling Service, the Common Fund, and other organizations. As an alternative to serving on a church board, you might serve as a special church representative.

The event will be held in the gymnasium of The River Community Church (RCC), 3001 Muscatine Avenue, in Iowa City. This facility has plenty of parking space and is on a bus route.

This year CRC will be partnering with the Iowa City Police Department (ICPD), which will provide clothing donations & volunteers. Shortly after the 2023 event, the ICPD held a one-day WCD at Mercer Park Recreation Center, distributing about 1,000 coats donated at their community collection boxes. They were interested in developing a new approach, so a community facilitator brought CRC & ICPD representatives together for a series of meetings that culminated in this partnership.

For 2024 they will be increasing the number of family representative shoppers to 10 per 30- minute period. As in past years, they are looking for donations of gently used or new WARM winter wear, with an emphasis on coats, snow pants, hats, mittens, gloves, scarves, boots & winter shoes. Heavy sweaters & sweatshirts are also appreciated.



GUNS TO GARDENS—OCTOBER 5

First Presbyterian Church (FPC) will be hosting the first *Guns to Gardens* event in the state of Iowa on Saturday, October 5th from 10 a.m. to noon, in its parking lot.

Guns to Gardens is inspired by Isaiah 2:4 "They shall beat their swords in plowshares and their spears into pruning hooks." It is a nationwide faith-based initiative taking direct action to address the national epidemic of gun violence. The event itself is an anonymous safe surrender. Community members bring unwanted guns to be destroyed and ultimately melted down to be transformed into garden tools or pieces of art. (cont'd)

This will be a drive through event where the gun owner brings their unloaded gun (or guns) in their trunk and is met by volunteers to guide them through the parking lot. Trained volunteers will remove the guns, confirm they are unloaded, and place them at the chop saw station. Guns will be destroyed by a chop saw according to guidelines from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives. The gun owner is present for the whole process, therefore there is no transfer of ownership. The gun owner is offered spiritual support throughout the process by a volunteer "shepherd" if desired. They are then given a gift card to thank them for the gun surrender. The gun parts are collected and will be donated to RAW Tools (rawtools.org) to be turned into garden tools and art.

SHARE THE HARVEST: John Fuller and Kathy Fait have been bringing beautiful flowers and tempting vegetables every Sunday for several years...all from their gardens. A free -will donation is requested for the bouquets, apples, young kale, chard, tomatoes, scapes, and other great vegetables. And, this year the donations, which are sent to the CommUnity Food Bank, reflect the generous giving from our congregation. As of September 23, John and Kathy's efforts have already raised \$447.12 from members, which will be sent to fight against food insecurity in our community.
