


WEAR RED ON PENTECOST SUNDAY, JUNE 8.



MISSION BOARD ACTIVITIES

The Mission Board held a half-day retreat in early March to set the agenda for this year. Our top 6 mission priorities were agreed upon after a survey of the members. These priorities include:

- 1 Food insecurity,
- 2 Immigration/refugees
- 3 Children/youth/childcare
- 4 Health/medical/mental health
- 5 LGBTQ+
- 6. Basic Living needs



So far, we have donated to the following organizations based on these priorities:

\$1950 to Little Creations Daycare. This includes \$1450 as part of our multi-year commitment to them and \$500 to help with consumable supplies such as diapers, gloves, crayons, and other craft supplies. (Priority 2 and 3) (cont'd)



\$5000 United Action for Youth Festival of Flowers (Priority 3, 4, 5)

\$2500 Free Medical Clinic (Priority 4)

\$1400 Table-to Table (Priority 1)

\$1000 Free Lunch Program (Priority 1) \$500 OneIowa (Priority 5)

\$400 for Pride Parade participation

This was previously sponsored by the University but the Alliance was part of the cuts made to be in compliance with state law. DRAINAGE PROJECT UPDATE



The disturbed areas around our church are part of a once in a generation drainage project, designed to upgrade our capacity to handle precipitation and prevent damage to our foundation. We have replaced all gutters and downspouts and are taking advantage of the University's utility tunnel replacement project, to allow us to more effectively move water away from our build-

ing and into storm sewers. Excavation for underground tiling will continue on our east and south sides. All areas will be repaved as needed.

We expect the work to be completed during the first week of June. Parking at the church will be limited during this work. Your patience is appreciated.

IOWA CITY NO KINGS PROTEST—JUNE 14

NO KINGS is a national day of action and mass mobilization in response to increasing authoritarian excesses and corruption: crack downs on free speech, detaining people for their political views, the threatened to deportation of American citizens, and defiance of the courts.



On Saturday, June 14, people will show up across the United States to say no thrones, no crowns, no kings The flag belongs to us. Join your neighbors at the corner of Iowa and Clinton from 11 am-2pm.

A core principle behind all No Kings events is a commitment to nonviolent action. We expect all participants to seek to de-escalate any potential confrontation with those who disagree.
