Friends in Christ—

Paul once quoted a Greek philosopher saying that in God "we live and move and have our being." In life terrible things happen and wonderful things happen. Through all of them—and often right in the midst of them—we sense the reality of God, creating, redeeming, and sustaining all of life.

Out of this awareness, every once in a while we remember the people who have been important in our lives who are no longer living. Although they are no longer present physically, they continue to influence our lives, helping us to be better people than we might otherwise be, strengthening us to love more than we might otherwise love, and giving us the courage to do what is right in the face of opposition. A member of a church I once served told me that in some ways he felt his father more present with him after his father's death—an experience others have spoken about as well.

Now and then we look around and our hearts are filled with gratitude toward God. This can happen when everything falls into place and life seems very good indeed. Surprisingly, it can also happen when everything falls apart and we are struggling to get through each day. Even then we recognize the sustaining power of God.

From time to time we look forward in hope, realizing that the past and the present are moving us toward something new, that the story isn't finished yet. In faith at such times we trust in the goodness of that the new thing that is coming into being, that is seen only dimly.

When we remember and give thanks and look ahead all in one month, we call that November. This year November gives us All Saints Sunday, Thanksgiving Day, and the First Sunday in Advent. That's a lot of religious life to put into thirty days. These days and this month remind us that all of life is in God's care. Often enough, we need that reminder.

SERVING OUR CONGREGATION

Every year in January a slate of new members for the various church boards is presented to the congregation for approval. Work to prepare this slate occurs throughout the fall and is managed by the two Council Members At Large, Marie Von Behren and David McCartney.

What is involved in serving on a Board? Each of the six church Boards meet monthly, usually on a week day evening. Each of the boards has different responsibilities, and thus the tasks undertaken by each board are different. For example, the Membership Board plans the church picnic and other fellowship events; the Trustees provide oversight of the church budget and the building.

In addition to positions on church boards, there are also several positions representing the church to various agencies and organizations. Members of the church serve as representatives to the Eastern Iowa Association, the Community Pastoral Counseling Service, the Common Fund, and other organizations. As an alternative to serving on a church board, you might serve as a special church representative.

ALTERNATIVE GIVING FOR CHRISTMAS—CRAFTS ARE WELCOME!



WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE EASTERN IOWA ASSOCIATION?

Our **Iowa Conference of the United Church of Christ (UCC)** is made up of six (6) Associations, The Congregational UCC of Iowa City is part of the **Eastern Iowa Association (EIA)**. We have about 30 churches in the EIA. Associations authorize ministers, support and care for clergy, and encourage churches on their faith journeys.

EIA had their 2025 Annual Meeting on Sunday, September 28th at Edwards UCC in Davenport to report on the activities that our churches and ministers are involved in. We attended to our association's business, we heard from our General Synod delegates, and we recognized the work of our new Iowa Conference Minister and Associate Conference Minister. We had 15 churches represented with 10 delegates, 6 visitors, and 28 clergy. A very strong representation!

The Rev. Ann Molsberry and Betsy Henson were installed as new members onto the EIA Committee on Ministry (COM). The EIA COM recognized The Rev. Bill Lovin for his 40th Anniversary of Ordination and The Rev. Craig Henderson for his 15th Anniversary of Ordination. Congratulations!!!

The Rev. Roberto Ochoa is our new Iowa Conference Minister (CM), he is also the Tri Conference Minister (TCM). The Rev. Kendy Miller is our Iowa Associate Conference Minister (ACM). The Rev. Bob Molsberry is our Iowa Conference Deacon. The Rev. Ann Molsberry and Betsy Henson are our EIA delegates from the Congregational UCC of Iowa City. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN THE IOWA CONFERENCE?

There are about 155 churches in the Iowa Conference UCC. In 2016 the Iowa Conference voted to join with the Nebraska and South Dakota Conferences to form the Tri Conference. We are separate conferences with separate finances, but we share some office staff and resources, a finance officer, and Conference Minister. There are about 250 churches in the Tri Conference UCC. Next year will be the 10th Anniversary of the Tri Conference.

The Iowa Conference UCC had its 2025 Annual Meeting on Sunday, October 11th at Plymouth UCC in Des Moines to report on the business and activities that our churches and ministers are involved in here in Iowa. The Tri Conference meets *biannually* at a Joint Annual Meeting (JAM). The Iowa, Nebraska, and South Dakota Conferences also have their *separate* annual meetings during JAM.

WELCOME REV. ROBERTO OCHOA!

In the afternoon, after our annual meeting, we installed the Rev. Roberto Ochoa as our Iowa Conference Minister (CM). Nebraska and South Dakota installed Rev. Roberto Ochoa as their CM on separate dates. The Rev. Kendy Miller is our Iowa Associate Conference Minister (ACM). The Rev. Bob Molsberry is our Iowa Conference Deacon. The Rev. Ann Molsberry and The Rev. Craig Henerson are our Iowa Conference delegates from the Congregational UCC of Iowa City. Please, if you have any questions or concerns, speak to one of us!



Who is our New Iowa Conference Minister (CM)/Tri Conference (TCCM)?

The Rev. Roberto Ochoa has been with the United Church of Christ for 20 years and served most recently as the Lay Pastor for Lake View Congregational Church, an Open and Affirming Congregation in Worcester, MA since 2012 and as Outreach Minister for Worcester Fellowship, an out-door Church ministry to the homeless, the economic poor and marginalized communities since 2016. He has over 30 years' experience in the areas of Latinx, Communities of Color, LGBTQA+ and cross-cultural ministries within the Christian Church and Multi-Faith settings. He earned his Master of Divinity from Andover Newton Theo-logical School in 2017 with Certificates in Ethics and Social Justice, and for Spiritual and Pastoral Care.

The Rev. Roberto Ochoa was installed as the Iowa Conference Minister (CM) on Saturday, October 11th. He was installed as the Nebraska CM on Saturday, May 17th and he was installed as the South Dakota CM on Saturday, October 4th. The three conferences will share the Rev. Roberto Ochoa's time and expenses through the Tri Conference (TCM).

MISSION BOARD FOOD DRIVE IN NOVEMBER



As many of you know, the government shutdown will result in a suspension of SNAP benefits starting Nov 1. This will lead to significant problems for those depending on these benefits to purchase food. In addition, food banks have been very stressed as the price of food has risen considerably. The Mission Board is sponsoring a food drive in November to respond to this crisis. Please bring stable shelf items to the church on the Sundays in November and the MB will deliver to the local food banks. If you prefer a monetary gift, just place it in the offering plate

and it will be sent. As you consider the items to donate, be aware that many boxed items require additional ingredients such as butter and milk for mac and cheese boxes, and meat for hamburger helper. If those items are not available, the food is not useful. Protein sources, such as tuna, canned chicken and peanut butter are often requested.

DR. JAMES ZOGBY JOINS VETERANS FOR PEACE ARMISTICE DAY OBSERVANCE



On Tuesday, Nov. 11, 2025, beginning at 11 a.m. CST, the local chapter of Veterans For Peace will hold three public events in Iowa City to re-dedicate ourselves to the work of peace. Members of the public are encouraged to attend.

- 1) Beginning at 10:45 a.m., we will assemble at the Iowa City Ped Mall. Bells will ring at the 11th hour, 11th day, 11th month, as is tradition. Dr. James Zogby will make brief remarks. In 1985, Zogby co-founded the Arab American Institute, a Washington, D.C.-based organization which serves as the political and policy research arm of the Arab American community. He continues to serve as its president. Zogby is also Director of Zogby Research Services, a firm that has conducted groundbreaking surveys across the Middle East.
- 2) Immediately following the outdoor observance, Veterans For Peace will host a free luncheon at the Iowa City Public Library. Dr. Zogby will address the group in a longer format. His topic is "The war that didn't end all wars and instead launched a century of conflict."
- 3) At 6:30 p.m., Veterans For Peace will sponsor a screening of the film "Earth's Greatest Enemy", a film by Abby Martin at FilmScene, 404 East College Street, Iowa City. This is a documentary exposé of the world's biggest—and most unaccountable—polluter: the US military. Learn the environmental cost of having a military Empire. Co-director/co-author of the film, Mike Prysner, will attend and offer brief remarks before the screening. He will host a question-and-answer period immediately afterward. FilmScene requests a free will donation to attend. This is the sole Armistice Day observance in the State of Iowa.
