Friends in Christ:

Back in 1966, when I was a kid, my father brought home the Dean Martin Christmas Album, a very groovy and swinging take on some seasonal music. It became a favorite of mine—although I have no idea what happened to the album over the ensuing years.

I thought of this when I read that Senior White House Aide, Stephen Miller, woke up on the day after Christmas and posted on X: "Watched the Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra Family Christmas with my kids. Imagine watching that and thinking America needed infinity migrants from the third world."

Set aside for right now that Bill Melendez, an American who immigrated to this country from Mexico, was the driving force behind the now 60 year old classic, *A Charlie Brown Christmas*.

As *The Daily Beast* reported: "Sinatra was particularly outspoken against "race- and color-haters," whom he blasted in a 1991 op-ed for The <u>Los Angeles Times</u> titled "The Haters and Bigots Will Be Judged: Some words from a 'saloon singer' to those who still haven't figured out the whole point of America."

"Who in the name of God," Sinatra continued, "are these people anyway, the ones who elevate themselves above others? America is an immigrant country. Maybe not you and me, but those whose love made our lives possible, or their parents or grandparents. America was founded by these people, who were fed up with other countries. Those weren't tourists on the Mayflower—they were your families and mine, following dreams that turned out to be possible dreams."

In a sermon a couple of years ago I mentioned Sinatra's relentless championing of Black jazz artists like Ella Fitzgerald and Count Basie. When Sinatra once noticed singer Nat Cole eating dinner in a hotel dressing room, he invited him to the main dining room, where Black people were not allowed. Sinatra then warned the hotel's management that he would get the entire serving staff fired if they didn't integrate the dining hall.

That was the first time I had ever used Frank Sinatra in a sermon as an example of what it means to follow in the way of Jesus Christ: Inviting others, welcoming everyone at the table.

Now I say it again. Be more like Frank. It's the groovy, swinging thing to do as we continue to figure out the whole point of America.

On Epiphany Sunday (January 4), we remember the story of Joseph and Mary, fleeing with the baby Jesus, becoming refugees from the murderous King Herod, living in Egypt for some time.

On the Sundays after Epiphany this year, our Mission Board is sponsoring a series of speakers addressing immigration issues in our nation and our community. There is more information about this inside this newsletter.

The fact is, we do need immigrants. The living Christ welcomes all people—and we hope that we too might extend such a welcome, share such grace, and, you know, be more like Frank.

Over the past year, we distributed all funds allocated to the Mission Board, along with an additional \$45,000 from the church's special funds. SHARE THE HARVEST UPDATE

The snow in November covered the final kale crop and meant the end of the harvest. \$1300 was sent to the CommUnity Crisis Center Food Pantry from the proceeds of the sale of produce and flowers. Always check the email address before replying to suspicious emails; if it isn't from "@uccic.org," it is a fake email address. And the main phone number Bill uses is the church's landline: 319-337-4301. Any other number with a suspicious request is another indication of a scam.
