On October 31, 1517, Martin Luther posted 95 Theses (propositions) on the door of the Wittenberg Castle Church as an invitation to debate the sale of indulgences for forgiveness. That was one event in a centuries-long movement that eventually became the Protestant Reformation. Today we mark Reformation Sunday and pray for a church that is always open to reform and the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Our worship service on this day is both solemn and joyful, befitting a congregation of people who live in the light of the resurrection. As is our custom, we will have a jazz band leading our worship on this Sunday in order to help us look toward that day when the saints go marchin' in.
