ALL SAINTS SUNDAY—Each year on the First Sunday in November, Congregational UCC observes "All Saints Sunday." This is a time for us to remember and give thanks to God for the lives of those members of Congregational UCC who have died in the past year—and for all the saints. This year we remember **Margaret Loughry, David Carew, Bill Williams, and Mary Heininger.** Our worship service on this day is both solemn and joyful, befitting a congregation of people who live in the light of the resurrection. As is our custom, we have a jazz band leading our worship this Sunday to help us look toward that day when the saints go marchin' in. Our friend, the well-known jazz pianist Dick Watson, is joined today by Gary Palmer, bass, and Craig Wood, drums.

We will receive our Neighbors in Need (NIN) offering this morning. NIN is a special mission offering of the United Church of Christ that supports ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. One-third of NIN funds support the <u>Council for American Indian</u> <u>Ministry</u> (CAIM). Two-thirds of this offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries (JWM) to support a variety of justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects through grants. Neighbors in Need grants are awarded to UCC churches and organizations doing justice work in their communities. These grants fund projects whose work ranges from direct service to community organizing and advocacy to address systemic injustice.

This year offering is focused on supporting organizations and projects that are serving homeless and immigrant neighbors or communities.

JOIN THE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INTERVENTION PROGRAM ON NOVEMBER 14TH AT 4-7 PM, 430 BROWN ST, FOR A GIFT SALE FUNDRAISER.

You can choose from a wide selection of handmade jewelry, donated goods from Rotarians and local business owners. They will only allow 20 people into the sale at a time and masks are required to be worn at all times. Cash, credit card and check accepted.

The Rotary Club of Iowa City Downtown is partnering with the Domestic Violence Intervention Program to put solar panels on the roof of the emergency shelter. Money saved on electricity will go directly to programs to help victim-survivors while the solar panels will reduce the shelter's impact on climate change.

Progress made

Through grants and donations, enough money has been raised for a system of about 64 solar panels to be installed on the roof in early 2022. The goal is to raise an additional \$35K for the purchase of a full-size, 128 panel system for the emergency shelter. Each year, this system would prevent carbon emissions equivalent to what could be sequestered by 52 acres of forest in that year. Each panel cost roughly \$600. *For the month of November, a generous donor will be matching up to \$5K of monetary donations – so your gift will be doubled!*
