THIS MORNING WE WILL RECEIVE A SPECIAL OFFERING FOR EARTHQUAKE RELIEF EFFORTS IN TURKEY AND SYRIA. Funds from the offering will be sent to Church World Service (CWS). While CWS is not active in either Turkey or Syria, they work closely with the European based Action by Churches Together (ACT). ACT is already in those countries helping with the relief efforts. Immediately after the 7.8 magnitude earthquake struck in the early hours of the morning on February 6, ACT members began to conduct rapid needs assessments in Syria and Turkey. They also began to provide life-saving aid including food, medicine, and warm blankets to families who lost everything to the quake even as search and rescue efforts continue to free survivors from the rubble. CWS will forward our gifts to ACT for their ongoing work in the affected areas.
