COMMUNITIES ACTING IN CRISIS: This morning we will finish our look at the part the churches played in creating the 1989-91 "Monday Demonstrations" in Leipzig, Germany, that led to the collapse of East Germany and the coming down of the Wall.

We are "crowd sourcing" the information that we will bring to the discussion.
