A NOTE FROM REV. ANN MOLSBERRY—The Circle of the Church Year I invite you to take a closer look at the Christian Education Bulletin Board in Rockwood Hall. It is a display of our church school curriculum from this past year. I created the curriculum, gleaning from my experiences as a teacher and learning theory, our UCC theology, and my seminary education. The Circle of the Church Year is a three-year curriculum based on the chronological flow of Scripture and the Liturgical calendar of the church year. This is year One. It is based on teachers needing background and a brief, one-page Biblical interpretation of the lesson and the children needing a hands-on experience to learn. ADULT EDUCATION SESSIONS CONCLUDE A YEAR OF EXPLORING POLARIZATION AND THE FUTURE OF DEMOCRACY: Since last September our Sunday morning adult education sessions have been considering how we talk with each other in this polarized time. Among other resources, we've watched several videos from Princeton Theological Seminary's "Future of American Democracy" series. We'll wrap up our sessions on the first three Sundays in May, considering "Does Institutional Christianity Have a Future?" with Rev. Adam Russell Taylor, President of Sojourners, and Rev. Dr. Russell Moore, Public Theologian at Christianity Today. They discuss the ongoing role Christian institutions play in supporting the project of democracy, and how political binaries work against our identities as siblings in Christ. We'll also listen as Princeton Theological Seminary faculty discuss the impact of polarization on students, campus culture, the classroom, and how theological education offers a way forward., in "Is Life Together Still Possible? Polarization and Princeton Seminary." Join us in Rockwood Hall on May 7, 14, and 21, at 9:15 a.m.
