REOPENING NEWS: We took another step in reopening our church building as Jenn Harden, our new Office Manager, began working here this past week. Jenn has experience both in

working at a church and in working as an administrative assistant. She is excited about returning to a church setting. At first, she will work 10-15 hours per week. As we increase in-person activities, her hours will increase to 20 hours per week.

REOPENING NEWS: The Reopening Committee is making progress as we plan for a safe return to in-person worship services. We are increasing our internet capability so that we can livestream our worship when we return to Sunday morning services. We are making sure that our filters and air intake provide for high air quality in the sanctuary. Our current plans look at restarting in-person worship in early August. Some church boards have started meeting at the church.

Table to Table Seeks Volunteers

Our volunteers keep good food from going to waste by rescuing it from food donors and delivering it to area agencies that serve people who are food insecure. In 2019 our volunteers rescued 2.5 million pounds of food, serving 19,000 neighbors in need!

Volunteers interact with food donor organizations, box up and load food donations into a Table to Table van, and transport and unload the food at recipient organizations such as community pantries, shelters, preschools, etc.

Route shifts typically take place between 8am-Noon Monday-Friday and last about 2-3 hours. Number of shifts each week depends on the need and the volunteer's availability. We also have a

limited number of routes on Saturday mornings. During the summer we also have opportunities related to gleaning fresh fruits and vegetables.

Things to know:

- Must have a valid driver's license and access to a vehicle
- Volunteers typically lift 30-40 lb. boxes of food
- Must be willing to volunteer a minimum of 30 total hours
