SCRIPTURE LESSON—1 Kings 19:1-4, (5-7), 8-15a

PSALM 42 and 43

As a hart longs for flowing streams, so my soul longs for you, O Beloved. My soul thirsts for the Beloved, for the Living Water. When may I come and behold your face?
