From producer Rob Reiner, *God and Country* examines the implications of Christian nationalism and how it distorts not only our constitutional republic but Christianity itself. Through the voices of prominent leaders, constitutional scholars, and journalists, the film asks the question: "What happens when a faith built on love, sacrifice, and forgiveness grows political tentacles, conflating power, money, and belief into hyper-nationalism."

- Sunday, August 25 @ 3:00 p.m. at St. Andrew Presbyterian Church (140 Gathering Place Ln, Iowa City). The movie will be followed by a discussion led by Connie Ryan of Iowa Interfaith Alliance.
