VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED FOR OUR WARM WINTER WEAR DISTRIBUTION!

Location: 340 Southgate Avenue, far east end of The GuideLink Center Volunteers are needed for three days of sorting and organizing:

- -5 volunteers needed for 3 hours on Sunday, October 17 (2 5 p.m.)
- -5 volunteers needed per 3 hour shift on Monday, October 18, and Tuesday, October 19, at 9 noon; noon 3 p.m.; 3 p.m. 6 p.m.

Volunteers are also needed for <u>three-and-a-half days of clothing distribution</u>; shopping begins Wednesday, October 20, and ends on Saturday, October 23:

- -5 volunteers are needed for all shifts on Wednesday through Saturday
- at 9 a.m. 6 p.m. W-F, 9 Noon on Sat. (Clean up 12 3)

These volunteers will assist shoppers each day, serving as guides. They will also keep the space organized & restock the tables.

Shoppers must have an appointment, with one adult per family allowed to select items for the family. Five shoppers will be admitted each 1/2 hour. They will also sign up via SignUp Genius.

Following health guidelines, we plan to keep the number of people in our space distanced and safe. Shoppers and staff are all required to wear masks.
